

Registrations for the 2026 Train the Trainer Course Part I are now OPEN!

The European Society of Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care (ESAIC) recognises that the standard of teaching of Anaesthesiology is a vital element of ensuring that our patients receive high quality safe care. Many Anaesthesiologists are involved in teaching; however, they are not often taught how to deliver education. To address this need, the ESAIC developed the TTT course - a blended course developed to share knowledge and inspire participants to become educators and leaders who strive for improvement in anaesthesiology education.

About the Train the Trainer Course 2026

The course, a successor to the successful Teach the Teacher course held since 2013, is conducted in English and is made up of two distinct but interconnected parts.

The **first part**, which is **currently open for registrations**, **is online** and includes a series of modules taking part in an asynchronous learning environment complemented by synchronous online ZOOM sessions, over the course of four months. The course will be launched in February 2026.

This online course aims to provide you with the basic teaching skills needed to improve you as a trainer and make your teaching sessions more effective and engaging.

At the end of the first (online) part participants will be able to:

- Organise and deliver effective formal and informal teaching sessions
- Have a systematic approach to teaching
- Observe performance of residents and students and provide good feedback
- Understand the basic principles of assessment and types of assessment used in the workplace and in more formal examinations
- Use the tools from the course to guide personal development as a trainer

The maximum number of participants for **Part I** is limited to **100 students**. A Part II in-person segment of the duration of, one week, will follow in autumn 2026 (TBC). Selected participants (30 maximum) from the Part I will be invited to register for Part II, upon its successful completion (more details on the selection criteria will follow). Participation in the TTT Part II is subject to an additional registration fee covering the costs organisation. The registration will not cover other incidentals (i.e. travel and accommodation costs). More details on the Part II will follow in due time.

Registrations for Part I are open, until 31 January 2026 (23:59 CET), to Specialist and last year residents ONLY who hold an Active, Affiliate, Allied and Trainee ESAIC membership. In total, 100 places are available for this course (Part I). Once places are covered, registrations might close earlier to this deadline without further notice. A 100 € fee excluding VAT (75 € for participants from reduced fee country list) is required to be paid upon registration.
